# 'COMMUNITY BUILD DAY' AT GILBERT LINDSAY RECREATION CENTER IN SOUTH L.A.

~ The City of los Angeles Department of Recreation & Parks Teams with the Television News Women of Los Angeles to Build the Anne & Kirk Douglas Boundless Playground—A Place for Kids of All Ages and Abilities

LOS ANGELES, CA (May 27 2010) — There is some good news to report. . . The City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks has teamed up with some philanthropic friends in our community to make a difference at the Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center by installing a Boundless Playground for kids of all ages. The Boundless Playground will be named after legendary actor Kirk Douglas and his wife Anne, in honor of their tireless efforts to install more than 400 playgrounds in underserved areas of Los Angeles.

The playground project will officially get underway on Saturday, May 29<sup>th</sup> with a "Community Build Day" right in the heart of L.A. City officials including **Mayor Antonio R. Villaraigosa** and **Councilmember Jan Perry**, 9th District, (in which Gilbert Lindsay is located) are among those who will be involved in the daylong project. They will be present right alongside community volunteers to help install the new playground equipment and begin to green-up the area around the playground and Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center.

The Boundless Playground is one that can be used by all children, regardless of ability. Features include ramped wheelchair access to the highest platforms, pathways with rubberized surfacing, swings with high back support, music elements, and much, much more.

Department of Recreation and Parks, General Manager, Jon Kirk Mukri states, "This playground will be one of the best the city has to offer. This will be the city's second Boundless Playground. I am excited to able to offer recreation and play that kids of all capabilities can enjoy. I would like to thank our many sponsors and partners that have come together to make this possible, helping one community at a time through collaboration."

This significant contribution to the City of Los Angeles is made possible because of a number of generous sponsors including: **CVS Caremark All Kids Can**—a program of the *CVS Caremark Charitable Trust*—with a five-year, \$25 million commitment to making life easier for children with disabilities. The *CVS Caremark Charitable Trust* has donated more than \$4 million to the nonprofit organization **Boundless Playgrounds** to build more than 50 Boundless Playgrounds nationwide. Additional sponsors include **Playcore**, **Game Time**, **Great Western**, **Robertson Industries**, and **The Home Depot** (which will complete the 'greening-up' of the entire area in the coming weeks). **The Good News Foundation** is also a proud sponsor of the entire playground project.

"We've been looking to 'jump' on a playground project ever since we named Anne & Kirk Douglas 'Good News Makers of the Year' in 2008," says Wendy Burch, KTLA reporter and the Chairperson of The Good News Foundation. "We wanted to make 'good' on our promise to dedicate a playground in their name, and we believe this Boundless Playground will provide endless hours of enjoyment and pay fitting tribute to all that the Douglas's have done."

Volunteers age 12 and older are invited to participate in a "Community Build Day" for the Anne & Kirk Douglas Boundless Playground at Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center located at 425 E. 42nd Pl., on Saturday, May 29, 2010. Registration begins at 7:00 a.m.

Snacks will be provided throughout the day thanks to the generous donations from CVS/pharmacy, Togo's, Subway, Foodtown, and Smart & Final. Additionally *The Good News Foundation* will be teaming up with **Don Chow's Taco Truck** to provide a delicious lunch for all of the volunteers.

The Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center has a rich history. This is the site of the original Wrigley Field, the Los Angeles ballpark which hosted the minor league baseball teams in the region for over 30 years. It was also Home Park for the Los Angeles Angels in their expansion season of 1961. The recreation center is named after Gilbert William Lindsay. Gilbert William Lindsay was the first person of African descent to serve as a Los Angeles City Councilmember in the modern era, serving from 1962 until 1990.
